Call 911

Gather information on this card

Don't move your bike

Get video or written testimonies from witnesses

Make sure police write down your side of the story

Never admit fault

If injured, go to the emergency room

Purchase the police report from buycrash.com

GEORGIA BIKE LAWS

In Georgia a bicycle is legally a vehicle, which means general vehicular traffic laws apply

SIGNS & SIGNALS: Bicyclists must obey all traffic signs and signals. Always signal your intentions when turning or stopping

LIGHTS: At night, the front of a bike must have a white light visible from 300 ft. The rear, a red light visible from 300 ft or a red reflector

CHILDREN: 16 & younger must wear a helmet

RIDE RIGHT: Ride as far to the right as practicable, except when turning left, avoiding hazards, or when the lane is too narrow to share

BIKE LANES: Ride in the same direction as traffic, even in bike lanes

BRAKES: Must have brakes that make wheels skid on dry pavement

SIDEWALKS: May not ride on sidewalks

INSURANCE: Not required, but uninsured motorist coverage strongly recommended
